Self-Image and Identity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain what is meant by the term 'identity' • Explain how they can represent themselves in different ways online • Explain ways in which and why they might change their identities, depending on what they are doing online (gaming/Avatars/social media)
Online Relationships	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe ways people who have similar likes and interest can get together online • Give examples of technology specific forms of communication (emojis/acronyms/text speak) • Explain some risks of communicating online with others they don't know well and know why they should be careful who they trust and what information they can trust them with • Explain how people's feelings could be hurt by what is said or written online , including their own • Explain what it means to 'know someone' online and why this might be different from knowing someone in real life • Explain the difference between 'trusting someone online' to 'liking someone online'
Online Reputation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Search for information about themselves online • Recognise the need of safety before sharing anything about themselves or others online • Know who they could ask if they are not sure if they should put something online
Online Bullying	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain what bullying is and describe how people may bully others • Describe rules on appropriate behaviour online and how to follow them
Managing Online Information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use key phrases in Search Engines • Explain what Autocomplete is and how to choose the best suggestion • Explain how the internet can be used to sell and buy things • Explain the difference between a 'belief', an 'option' and a 'fact'
Health Well-being and Lifestyle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain why spending too much time using technology can sometimes have a negative impact on them, and give examples of these (eg - games/films/videos)
Privacy and Security	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Give reasons why they should only share information with people they choose to and can trust, knowing that if they are not sure or feel pressured, they should seek guidance from a trusted adult • Understand and give reasons why passwords are important • Describe simple strategies for creating and keeping passwords • Describe how connected devices can collect and share information with others
Copyright and Ownership	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explain why copying someone else's work from the internet without permission can cause problems and give examples of what they might be
